On behalf of all the school staff, I hope you are all keeping safe and well. It is great to have some more of our children back at school but very disappointing that we cannot have all of you back just yet.

Those children that have returned have been absolutely brilliant and are enjoying getting back to their learning in school. They have been very quick to adapt to the changed expectations in school and are absolutely brilliant at social distancing – they have the 2m apart rule totally sorted – better than lots of adults!!!!!

Can I remind the parents of those children that have returned to school that it is crucial that if anyone in your immediate family household shows symptoms of COVID-19 you book a test immediately and follow the 'Test, Track and Trace Government Guidance'. We would also request that you inform school straight away so that we can follow the processes we have been given in school as quickly as possible. Thank you for your support with this.

# Continuing with home-learning for Years 2, 3, 4 & 5 (and children that have not returned in YR, 1 & 6)

I am sure you have seen the news this week where the Government have changed their mind regarding the return to school for children in Years 2, 3, 4 and 5 with the guidance being limited to only allowing the return of further year groups where there is capacity to do this maintaining the extensive guidance already issued. Whilst this current guidance has to be adhered to, we are unable to accept any further pupils back into school as we are at capacity.

In light of this we will be re-establishing additional measures to support learning from home, including the email and phone links with members of staff where you can share, celebrate and gain help and support with your children's home learning and well-being where necessary. As most staff are now busy teaching the children that have been directed to return to school, we will be reassigning groups of children to members of staff to keep in contact with. They may not be your child's current class teacher. The member of staff will be emailing you at the beginning of next week to make initial contact.

They will also be checking up on how you are getting on with the assigned learning on MyMaths, TTRockstars and Epic and will be looking forward to see how you are getting on.

Don't forget at the end of each exercise on MyMaths to press 'mark' so that it shows you how you have done and records the exercise as completed.

It's very important that children continue to do some form of learning every day to keep their minds active and tuned in – otherwise they will find it very difficult to get back into learning when we do eventually start back. Even having a go at just a few of the activities will be beneficial. Staff will continue to make the learning as fun and practical as possible. We know that several families are struggling to juggle two, three or more children on one device each day. When the member of staff makes email contact, please don't hesitate to let us know and as previously, we will ensure a paper pack of learning is delivered.

I know that many of you have completed lots and lots of fantastic learning at home which we were looking forward to seeing if you had been coming back to school in the next couple of weeks. I know that there are lots of pieces that the staff are eager to enjoy looking at, see how you've got on and display ready for the start of the new academic year in September. Because of the delay in your return, we would like to invite you to start to bring your work back to school from next week. We will place a plastic box outside the Crowden Road Pedestrian gate and outside the Fossdale KS2 gate for you to place your work in between 10am and 11.30am next week (15th to 19th June) for pupils in Year 5 / 4 and the following week (22<sup>nd</sup> to 26<sup>th</sup> June) for children in Year 3 / 2. Please place your work in a big envelope, a carrier, a wallet or a folder and make sure your child's name is on please. We will also leave some spare folders in

the box should you need one. We will repeat this process closer to the end of term as well. Please be mindful of the weather – we don't want anyone's learning to be ruined in the rain!
